SAGA OF A STOLEN SPEEDSTER AT LAND OF ENCHANTMENT TOUR

On Saturday morning, July 2, Don and Nancy Housman had planned to leave early for their return trip to Northern CA. Upon reaching their truck and trailer parking site, it was empty. Sometime in the early morning hours their truck, trailer and Speedster inside were stolen.

The truck was recovered that same day after being used in a burglary in Los Lunas. After media coverage and a reward announced several bogus leads were called in. On Monday, July 18th Larry Azevedo got a call from the police department about 7:30 this morning that the speedster was located. I was on the call list to pick up the car and/or trailer to avoid impounding charges. I hooked up my trailer and drove south of Albuquerque on I-25. The car was abandoned in an arroyo east of the Interstate just south of Rio Bravo and I-25. The officer took my identification and gave me the keys which were left with the car. It was in deep sand and hard to get my trailer lined up so I tried to start it. It started up just fine, oil pressure OK. I should have just drove it to a good spot to line the trailer but decided to turn it around and drive on the trailer. As luck would have it it died crossways in the sand and the battery did not have enough juice to turn it over. Since it has no crank I had to tow it a bit to line up with the trailer. Anyway, got it on the trailer and back to my house by 10 AM. There is no visible damage to the car. Don and Nancy Housman are really happy. Larry will be taking the Speedster, no sign of trailer yet, to CA in the next couple of weeks as the Housman's live less than twenty miles from his Mom's.

Thanks to the Media, NM Car Council, Larry Azevedo, Tin Lizzies, Bernalillo County Sherriff's Office, Albuquerque City Police and the NM State Police in their efforts to get this car back.

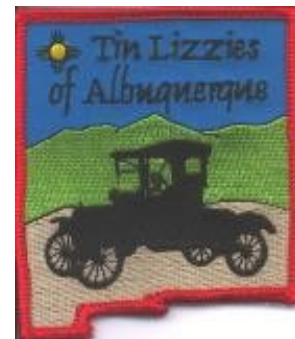
