Enchanted Loop Tour: September 28 thru October 1, 2017

We will travel to Red River on Thursday, September 28 and check in at the Riverside Lodge in Red River (unless you are taking an RV). We will be touring on Friday and Saturday and will return home on Sunday, October 1. Therefore, you need to make your reservation for 3 nights starting on Thursday, September 28.

Here is the lodge information:

Call 1 800 432 9999 for reservations. We are receiving the low seasonal rates and there are several options for lodge rooms including 2 person units, 3, 4, etc.

When you call to make your reservation, you can pick and choose what you want. Two person units 2C, 8C, 9C, 21C - 27C, 24C and 30C range in price from \$70 to \$89 per night. Four person units 10C, 11C, 3C, 4C - 7C, 12C - 19C range in price from \$86 to \$118 per night. Five person units 25C, 29C, 31C and 23C are \$128 and six person units 22C, 23C, 29C and 31C are \$138 per night. Lodge rooms 1L through 8L range from \$63 to \$89 per night and the Aspen Suites 14A through 16A range from \$102 to \$121 per night.

We will be able to park our trailers just north of Independence Street in a public lot, a short walk from the lodge. No pets are allowed and all the rooms are non-smoking. Smoking is allowed on balconies outside.

Mention the Tin Lizzies when you make your reservation. You will be required to make a deposit either by check or credit card for two nights. For more information about the lodge in Red River click on this link: <http://www.redriver-nm.com>

Garage Gossip (Azevedo, April '07) - Hanging Pictures

One of my most terrible 'honey-do' tasks is to hang pictures. I avoid this task like the plague. Why is it that studs are never where you want them? 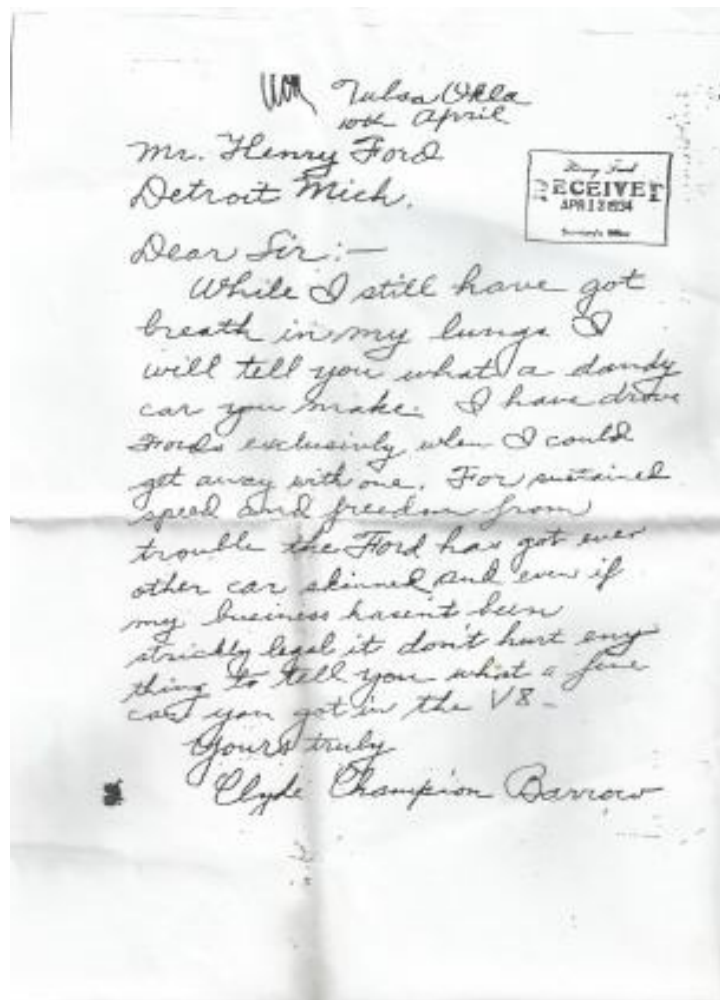

I am sorry for the confusion that I've caused regarding the collection and display of pictures of Model T cars owned by the members. What began as a simple idea has developed into a near-Hollywood production but I think the result will be worth the effort. The original idea was to obtain one picture from each member of their favorite car. The idea was to take the pictures along and display them with our cars whenever we had a static display such as the State Fair or a Rich Ford event. We wanted to show the enthusiasm and strength of our club by showing that we had many more members and cars than we usually bring to a show. So far, so good. Then the trouble began! I got the bright idea that we really needed to collect pictures of all members cars, even those in-progress restorations. We also wanted people in the pictures when possible. Trying to collect prints proved that we were going to get a lot of different sizes of prints, some with borders, some without, differences in resolution, etc. By experimentation, I determined that we needed a common format and 5x7 inch size. So I downloaded all of the pictures that we have posted on the Internet and tried to create a matrix in 5x7 prints to fit on 20x30 foamcore boards. Dumb idea! Most of those pictures were posted in reduced resolution and if you try to enlarge them to 5x7 they come out all fuzzy looking. Since Mark Wing took many of those pictures, I asked him for digital copies of any pictures that he has in the original resolution. It is a lot of work for him to do this but he is working on it. Thank you, Mark. OK! As soon as we get all of Mark's digital files, I'll inform the membership what cars we have pictures of, and to whom they belong. Then you all get to help! If you will review the list of the cars we have identified as belonging to you and confirm those you have, deny those that you no longer have and add those you have acquired (including works in progress) we should have a current moment-in-time inventory. I will then contact each of you to arrange pictures of the those we don't have (What could go wrong? There are only 87 Club members). I'll take the pictures, crop and enhance if necessary and add the name (s) of the owner (s), the model year and body style of the car, ie. Buzz Lightning, 1927 Rajo Speedster or Daisy Flower, 1912 Touring, etc. Then the 5x7 pictures will be randomly arranged on a matrix of 16 pictures each and printed as a 20x30 high quality poster. The posters will be mounted on foam-core boards and displayed wherever we want to show off the Club collection and activities. Think: Recruiting Tool!

Star Automobile Story

Tin Lizzie member, Jim Glover's 1923 Star touring car is currently on display at the Albuquerque Wheels Museum (<http://wheelsmuseum.org>). Jim tells the story that his car was discovered in the 1970s stuck in the desert near Palm Springs, CA. Only the windshield was sticking out of a sand dune. The prospectors who found the car, dug it up and found that it was rusty but complete except for the upholstery and the spare tire! Jim acquired the car in the late 1980s and set to work on the restoration. With his air compressor he blasted the sand out of the transmission, radiator, carburetor and installed Model T wheels. After adding fuel, he started the car right up, just like a Model T! What is a Star car? Jim describes it as having many Model T parts, resembles a Model T Touring of the era but Stars had a clutch pedal and a shifter.

Star automobiles were cars that were "assembled" (1922-1928) from various parts by the Durant Motors Co. The various parts were made by other car companies including Ford and GM. Durant Motors was started in 1921 by the former General Motors CEO, William "Billy" Durant after he left GM under fire. Durant Motors produced several car brands including Star, Flint and Durant. They were sold at various price points to compete with both the Ford and GM brands. The Star was the basic lower cost model. Although production of Star cars ended in 1928, Durant Motors continued business into the early 1930s. Their factories were later bought by GM's Fisher Body division. 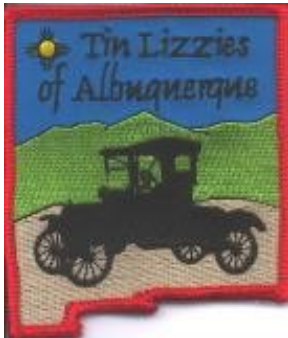
