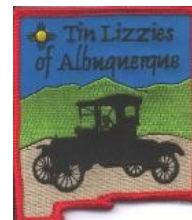

MODEL T QUICK FACTS

- ◆ The 1908 Model T got 20 mpg, and had a top speed of 45 mph
- ◆ The first Model T retailed for \$845, the last about \$290
- ◆ In 1914 one Model T rolled off the assembly line every 93 minutes
- ◆ By 1918, Half the cars in America were Model T's
- ◆ 1927, Production ended with the 15 millionth Model T
- ◆ Model T engines continued to be produced until 1941

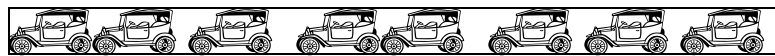

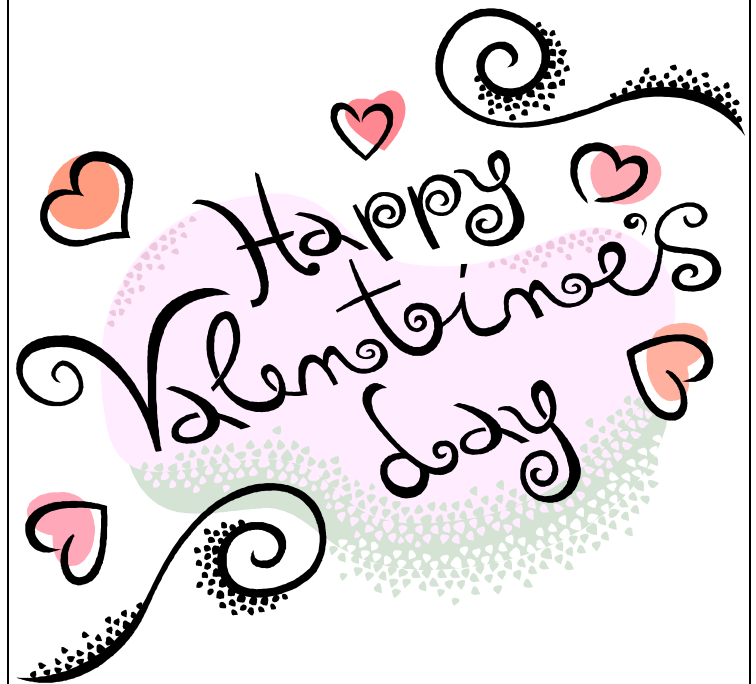

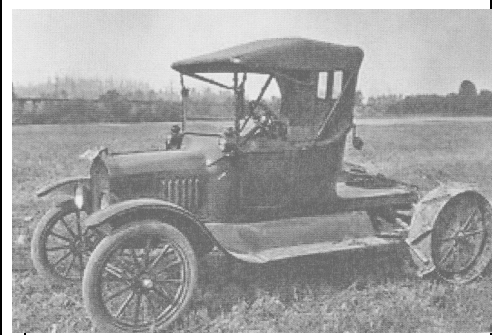

We took a break and had red beans & rice, strawberries and beignets.

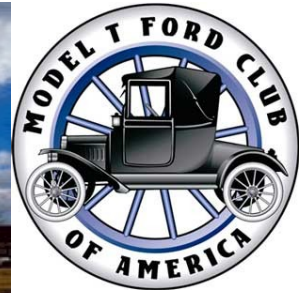
After break, Dean read the monthly birthday and anniversary lists. We also had a new member, Bob Sieglitz joined during our meeting.

Llano Estacado Spring Tour 2013

May 16-19, 2013



Wide open spaces, long country roads, and big sky touring, that's what eastern New Mexico offers you for your next Model T Tour. Located on the southwestern edge of the High Plains or "Llano Estacado," is a vast area of rich agriculture, ranching, and hidden treasures of history.

The Tour will be based in Portales. The town offers a comfortable slow pace that welcomes the Tin Lizzies and their Model T's. Upon arrival, check in to your rooms, relax, and before the day's over, enjoy the view of a beautiful eastern New Mexico sunset.



On Friday morning, you can enjoy breakfast at the hotel. Then, we'll travel north to the Caprock. This will be a nice drive. Our first stop will be up the road in Clovis for a nice welcome from the friendly crew at Skunk Werks, a restoration shop made up of the local Desert Cruzers car club members. They'll have coffee and donuts waiting for us.

After a brief stop at Shunk Werks, we'll head north and experience the freedom of the open road for the next 35 miles. We drive through the tiny communities of Broadview and Grady. We'll stop in Grady for a welcome from the public school students of the community.

After some question and answer, we travel 10 miles north where we'll tour the Caprock Wind Ranch. We'll be among the giants of wind mills, the 2nd largest wind turbine project in New Mexico.



After the Caprock Wind Ranch tour, we'll head back towards home stopping again in Grady for lunch with community members at the Senior Center

After lunch, we pack up and head for the long open sky 58 mile drive back through Clovis and into Portales and to our hotels where we'll rest and prepare for a nice dinner. We'll drive our Model T's to a local restaurant. After dinner we'll head back to our comfy hotels and unwind for the night.

Rise and shine early on Saturday morning as the Tin Lizzies head to breakfast at either the hotel, or down the street to a couple of nearby local breakfast favorites.

After breakfast, we'll meet at the hotel to depart for our first stop of the day, Eastern New Mexico University's Administration Building. Built in 1929 to 1934, this New Deal WPA



project stands above all others as a symbol of our past, present, and future. This will make a nice photo op with our Model T's and maybe a group photo.

Next stop is downtown as we'll wheel around the Roosevelt County Courthouse. Here we'll see another WPA building along with historic monuments that recognize the local history including a bronze statue of Portales' first Mayor and 3rd Governor of New Mexico. Another monument also stands recognizing the Portales women who wrote the official salute to the New Mexico flag.

We move along to our next destination, another windmill tour, this time it's going back in time to the famous Dalley Windmill Collection, one of the largest in the U.S.

From there we head out of town to the Blackwater Draw Site, one of the most significant in North American archeology. Blackwater Draw reveals evidence of the earliest occupation of the new world dating back 11,600 years. This site was discovered in the early 1920's. Since then, major institutions including the Carnegie Institute, Smithsonian, Academy of Natural Sciences, National Science Foundation, National Geographic Society, and others either have participated or have funded research at Blackwater Site.

After a quick review of early mammoths, bison, and Clovis points, we'll drive to the Norman Petty Studio where music legends Buddy Holly, Roy Orbison, Fireballs, Waylon Jennings, and others recorded their music. We'll walk back in time to the 1950's and listen to original sound cuts of these famous singers. The studio is exactly the way it was when Buddy Holly recorded there.



Once we say our goodbyes at the Norman Petty studio, we're off to lunch and then to Main Street Clovis to shop Antique stores until you drop! The brick paved Main Street offers several antique shops for all to enjoy.

After the shopping is done, we'll head back to the hotels for some rest and freshening up as we have a wonderful evening of dining waiting ahead.

The night's dinner banquet will be at the Vine's Italian Restaurant located in downtown Portales. This beautiful historic building was the location of Portales's first post office. The early 1900's architecture offers diners a feel of what the community was like in the early days. The evening's menu is especially prepared for our event. The selections offer a variety of wonderful dining not exclusive to Italian cuisine. We'll enjoy a wonderful evening of good food, drinks, and relaxation.

For those who would like an after dinner drink, we can walk a few steps over to The Roosevelt, a local brew house for a cold pint of their special brew or a glass of wine. The Roosevelt has a historic ambiance as well. Their motto is *"Drink Local, Support Freedom."*

After an evening out on the town, we head back to our hotels for a night of rest.

The next morning is open; get around at whatever time you fancy, breakfast at the hotel or nearby cafes. Pack, load up, and head to our respective homes. Until we meet again, safe travels!
