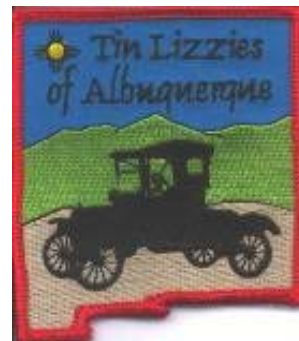

MEETING MINUTES
TIN LIZZIES OF ALBUQUERQUE
APRIL25, 2013

The meeting was called to order by President Dean Van Doren at 7:02 PM. The pledge was said by all. Dean welcomed new member Rose Ross. Refreshments tonight were hosted by Tom and Cathy Miles.

Tom Miles reported on the MTFCA standings from the last business meeting. Discussion was held about the online forum and policing it. It was decided not to police it but to ask people to be more civil and have pop-ups reminding people to be civil, hoping the instigators will go away. Membership is down. Discussion was held about the lateness of the *Vintage Ford*; Jay has stepped down as editor and Jennifer will take his place. The next MTFCA Business Meeting will be coordinated by Bernice Young. The attendance was good at the meeting and Larry Azevedo won the Rosenthal Award.

Bernice Young reported that the next MTFCA Business Meeting will be a cruise in February 2014. We don't have to do anything but show up. The cruise will be 2/24-28, 2014 out of Ft Lauderdale & everyone makes their own reservations. Taxes and port charges are not included in the published price. You need a passport or pass card. If as many as 10 people fly from ABQ to Ft Lauderdale together we can get group rates on SW Airlines. She has folders on the front table.

Dean read birthdays & anniversaries for May. Robbi is no longer the newsletter editor & Lorna will finish out the year. Thank you Robbi for a job well done. Dean then spoke about Larry Azevedo's idea to have an inventory. Since so many work parties are held at his place, Larry thinks that having an inventory of the most widely used parts in a separate bin would facilitate repairs. If you need something you simply buy it out of inventory or replace it into inventory. Dean said the treasury could support this at this time and we could use up to \$1000 for parts. John Hayne suggested that we buy in bulk for wholesale prices. Russell Dilts moved that we authorize Larry to spend \$1000 as separate use in the barn to be used as inventory and replaced when used. It was seconded by Betty Housholder and passed unanimously.

Llano Estacado Spring Tour 2013....May 16-19, 2013

A few Highlight Activities of the Llano Estacado Tour

Thurs evening, after everyone has arrived & checked in, we will gather at the hotel's banquet room for a meet & greet reception. We'll have the opportunity to mingle, meet new and old friends, & enjoy light food & drinks. Tour announcements will be made, we'll review the itinerary, & special guest & local resident, Dr. Tony Gennaro, biologist, author, & radio & TV personality will share with us what we are to expect on our tour in regards to the "Llano Estacado," High Plains area history & its landscape.

At about 7:30 pm, we'll drive our Model T's to the City of Portales "walking trails" park, a short distance from the hotel. There, we will experience an eastern New Mexico sunset. The park is of typical "llano" natural habitat, native grasses and yucca. There are also a variety of trees that have been planted by City Park and Recreation. The horizon to the west offers a wonderful scene of the setting sun. Estimated time for the sun to set is 7:49 pm.

If you enjoy flat, open space touring, **Friday** will fit the bill as our drive to Grady, NM and the Caprock offers the freedom of the High Plains, long stretch of farm roads, views of wide open spaces of grasslands and farms. The population of Grady, NM, all 107 await in anticipation for us to arrive in their small community. We'll have the opportunity to meet the student body and community citizens. This will be a special treat for this little community. We'll also have lunch with them on our way back from the Caprock.

A few examples for **Saturday** include the ENMU Admin. Bldg. Construction of this building was approved in 1929, but was delayed due to the Stock Market crash & subsequent Great Depression. The building did break ground in 1931 and in 1934, with it only partially built, opened its doors to the first year of students. The building was completed in 1936. The historic building of English Tudor design houses beautiful New Deal art. A 1936 mural, tempera on plaster, titled "The 12th Chapter of Ecclesiastes" by painter Lloyd Molan is painted on the 2nd story stairway walls. This fabulous building is an excellent backdrop for photos of the T's.

A unique stop along our tour is the Norman Petty Studio in Clovis. You step back in time as you enter the legendary recording studio that recorded music of Buddy Holly, Roy Orbison, Waylon Jennings, & the Fireballs, to name a few. Norman Petty & his wife, Vi, were talented artists with such hits as "Mood Indigo", & "Almost Paradise." Norman was most recognized for his record producing talents & his famous studio. He helped artists produce major hits as "Sugar Shack", "Bottle of Wine", "Everyday", "Peggy Sue", "That'll Be the Day", & many others. The studio has been preserved & cared for exactly the way it was in the days of those early Rock & Roll recordings. The original equipment including the microphones & recorders that Buddy Holly & others used are still present. You may get to hear an original out take of Buddy Holly's recordings. A wonderful historic Rock and Roll treat for all!

Time to shop! Clovis' downtown has many interesting antique shops. We'll drive our T's on the brick paved streets along Main St. as we check out what there is to offer. Who knows, maybe a nice vintage hat for the ladies, or a rusty old sign for the gentlemen.

There is a variety of eating establishments in both Portales and Clovis. Those include local café's offering home cooking to restaurants that serve steaks and seafood. One establishment that is a "must stop" for tasting local beer is the Roosevelt Brewing Company and Public House in downtown Portales. We'll provide a list of area eateries for you to have as a reference. Of course, we'll enjoy a nice dinner banquet at the "Vines Italian Restaurant" on Saturday evening. There will be a variety of entrees to choose from and a special menu will be provided in advance for your selections.

The above mentioned are only a portion of the activities scheduled. Look over the itinerary for a listing of all activities and stops.

BRING...lots of bottled water, sunscreen, hats, light jacket, cameras, & neck coolers (if you've got them).

Don't forget to bring something for the welcome party, ie appetizer & drinks of your choice to share!

Trailer parking will be provided at the University, if needed.
