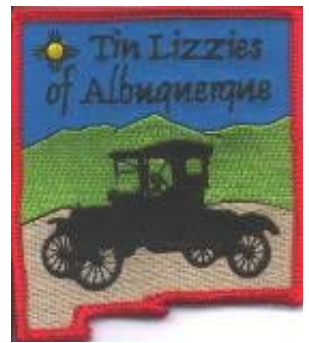

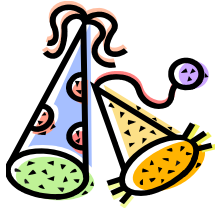
Balloon Fiesta Car Show Oct 6
