

Don'ts for Ford Owners!... From the Ford Manual 1915 Don'ts Before Starting

Don't start engine with spark advanced.

Don't start engine unless hand brake lever is set.

Don't try to start engine without gasoline in the tank.

Don't start engine without sufficient oil in crank case.

Don't try to start engine until you have turned on switch.

Don't start car without filling radiator with water.

Don't start car until throttle lever has been advanced 5 or 6 notches.

Don'ts when Running

Don't put clutch in high without reasonable start on low.

Don't race motor.

Don't see how quickly you can stop or how fast you can start.

Don't leave motor running when you leave car.

Don't forget to retard spark when motor begins to slow down or labor in pulling or ascending grade.

Don't use foot brakes continually when descending long grades. It is liable to burn the brake lining. Apply the slow speed pedal & operate against the compression of the engine, retarding the spark & throttle levers. This is an effective means of checking the speed of the car.




