

John Hayne's program on T timing gear cover plates explained differences over the years. The meeting was adjourned.


#### Via Condias, Rossi!!



#### The Road to Neon Tour, May 1-4, 2014

#### Tucumcari Tonight!! By Orlando Ortega

Route 66, the Mother Road was established in 1926 & became the most famous of U.S. highways, connecting Chicago to Los Angeles & many towns & cities in between. In New Mexico, those more recognized include from E to W, San Jon, Tucumcari, Santa Rosa, Moriarty, Albuquerque, Grants, & Gallup. Rt 66 opened the opportunity for commerce & recreation; people traveled by motorcar, as did goods & supplies by truck. The towns & cities that were along the route prospered as travelers stopped to rest, spending time & money in those communities. Over the decades, tourism grew along Rt 66. Motor Courts & diners became popular as travelers would stop for the night & enjoy a good meal & comfortable bed. Creative roadside advertising began to pop up along the highway encouraging travelers to stop. Motels & Curio shops with bright beautiful neon signs lured costumers. Service stations offered full service, maps, & ice cold sodas.

The introduction of interstate highways & truck by-passes in the late 60's & 70's re-routed traffic & affected the economy of these Rt 66 communities. Rt 66 was abandoned & interstates became the way of travel.

But even today, the romance of driving Rt 66 continues to attract many to its towns & cities throughout the U.S. as they still continue to offer the uniqueness of those days of the past. And many of our New Mexico communities continue to preserve the Rt 66 flavor, including Tucumcari, where you can still rent a Motor Court for you & your car, sleep comfortably under the glow of neon lights, & get a good meal at one of the diners along the route. Yes, you can still "Get Your Kicks on Rt 66" in Tucumcari!

There are three 30's to 50's era motels where we can stay, **Rt 66 Motel**, **575-461-1212**, **rte66motel.com**, **Safari Motel**, **575-461-1048**, or **The Blue Swallow**. **575-461-9849**, **blueswallowmotel.com**. **The Motel Safari** will be the headquarters. The rate is \$55.43 for 1 king or 2 full size, inc tax. Use the Tin Lizzie Tour name. Only 10 rooms are available & are blocked until Mar 18. These historic motels are clean, comfortable, & affordable. See rates for the others on line, or call. There's also **Holiday Inn Express 575-461-3333** & **Hampton Inn 575-461-1111**, & **Days Inn 575-461-3158** if you'd prefer to go modern.

**THURS-**Club reception at Safari Motel. We'll explore the area, including a tour of this mural city, a welcome reception from the Chamber of Commerce, photo museum, & find a restaurant for those still hungry.

**FRIDAY-**We'll start with an early 35 mi. drive to Conchas Lake & dam, a WPA, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers project completed in 1939.

We'll get a history lesson of the construction & labor it took to build this huge concrete structure. A special guided tour takes us to the belly of the dam. There's spectacular views & a pleasant outing. After the Dam tour, we'll enjoy a picnic lunch on the lake grounds, an outdoor lunch among friends, or maybe drive back to town for lunch at a local diner. The afternoon will be an opportune time to visit the "Trade Station" & the "Tucumcari Trading Post" at both ends of town. They offer unique, petroliana, rusty treasures, & collectibles. That evening, we can enjoy a nice dinner at any local diner or restaurant. Eat on your own.

**SAT-**Breakfast will be hosted by the owner of "La Tiendita" antique shop in downtown Tucumcari. Then we'll take old Rt 66 & go 38 mi E to Russell's Travel Center at Glen Rio. We'll see an auto & memorabilia museum. There's antique & classic cars, vintage gas pumps, coca cola machines, advertising & toy collection.

The travel center has souvenirs, snacks, drinks, & fuel. We'll enjoy lunch at their Rt 66 diner, maybe a juicy burger & shake!

After a Rt 66 lunch, we'll head W on the *Mother Road* to Tucumcari. Once back in town, we can explore & shop. The downtown main street area offers antique shops & a café or two for beverages & desserts.

After these activities, we're off to our motels for a little rest before preparing for our evening banquet dinner. We'll come together to enjoy our last evening of the tour with good dining & fun. After the banquet, those that enjoy dancing can join the Chamber of Commerce for their annual barn dance at the Convention Center.
