

The July 4th parade had 17 Model T's and 10 Model A's. About 95 members of the two groups attended the picnic at the Azevedo residence.

The T 'n V breakfast hosted by Dave and Ann Merewether was held at the Golden Corral and had 35 attendees and 3 cars for display.

Monsignor Richard Olona is now the owner of Ralph Johnson's 1924 Roadster and Monsignor Olona joined our club. John Konwiser is also a new member.

Kirk Peterson gave a report on the National Tour that some of our members attended. There were 100 cars that drove 333 miles. Places visited were Banff, Lake Louise and the Pioneer Village. Much of the tour was rained out.

Buena Vista Senior care at Wilshire and San Pedro invited members to bring Ts for the enjoyment of their residents.

Vaughn Rockafellow is in touch with organizers of the HVA Road Trip of the Century. A 1915 Model T and a 2015 Mustang left Detroit on July 17 to recreate a trip made by Edsel Ford to San Francisco. Orlando Ortega plans to meet the group in Las Vegas and travel with them to Albuquerque. All members desiring to join them for a part of the New Mexico trip may do so. Vaughn will keep

members updated as the schedule for arrival in Albuquerque is updated.
