



September 24, 2015

The raffle items this month included a magnetic Tin Lizzie Sign, a lock, and a radiator bracket and a mirror.

Meeting refreshments were provided by Sharon and Mark Dominguez.

Linda Riel reported success for the car display at Rich Ford Edgewood with 17 cars displayed. The weather was wonderful, there were lots of free refreshments, and some owners participated in the blood drive.

Paul Duncan reported that 15 cars and 34 people went on the Chama Tour. Three cars made the trip to Cumbres Pass. The planning committee of Robbi and Bob Ross, Marilyn and Paul Duncan, and Laura Kammerer and Dave Ferro had many enjoyable activities arranged for tour participants.

T 'n Vittles breakfast for September hosted by Linda Riel had 4 cars and 20 people at Denny's restaurant.

Several of our brave female members practiced twice for a Lady's T Take Apart demonstration for the State Fair. Larry Azevedo found it necessary to color code the wrenches for the participants and they were able to put a T together in 32 minutes at the State Fair. The men then decided to do their own Take Apart and their time was 20 minutes and 33 seconds. The Ladies inspection showed two nuts and a washer that had not been installed, so the ladies insisted that they be disqualified. For the State Fair exhibit on September 13 there were 15 cars. The State Fair Board awarded Vaughn Rockefeller with State Fair ribbons in appreciation for his years of spearheading the Model T exhibit at the fair.

Dave and Ann Merewether will be representing the Tin Lizzies as they assist at the Los Lunas Swap Meet.

Some of our members will be taking cars to the Corrales Harvest Fest.

Betty Householder gave out car passes to those who will be displaying cars at the Balloon Fiesta on October 4.

The Tin Lizzie Board of Directors will serve as a nominating committee to be voted on for officers for 2016. The list will be submitted at the October meeting and voting will be at the November meeting.

The Corrales Christmas Parade will be held December 5 with the club Christmas dinner following at the Azevedo residence. Dinner will be a potluck and Sharon Dominguez is in charge of sign-ups and volunteers. It was moved, seconded and passed that the club would provide the dessert and non-alcoholic beverages for the dinner.

The Albuquerque Tin Lizzie's Club was well represented at the 2015 Concours du Soleil Car Show by Dave Merewether's 1917 Model T Roadster Pickup. The T took a third place ribbon in the classic car division of the show themed "Driving to the Future". Competition was a 1913 Luna Car built in the 1950's at first place and a 1932 Packard 902 Opera Coupe that placed second. Other cars in the division was a 1931 Rolls Royce Phantom II and a 1940 Darrin Packard Victoria. The T description from the program read as follows: "A driver from the past. In 1917 cars were simpler. The Model T had no starter, no generator, no water pump, no fuel pump, no speedometer and no gauges. The engine was simple enough that farmers could make adjustments and repairs. This car was upgraded to the 1919 configuration with a starter and generator."
