



#### Model T History -One Hundred Years Ago

The Model T Ford 1918 Model Year ran from September 1, 1917 through January 1919

The United States had entered World War I in April 1917. President Wilson believed the United States should be neutral. However, "Wilson cited Germany's violation of its pledge to suspend unrestricted submarine warfare in the North Atlantic and Mediterranean, as well as its attempts to entice Mexico into an alliance against the United States, as his reasons in April 1917 for declaring War". British intelligence reported that they had intercepted and decrypted a telegram from German foreign minister Arthur Zimmerman to the German ambassador in Mexico City. The Zimmerman telegram¹ promised the Mexican government that Germany would help Mexico recover the territory it had ceded to the United States following the Mexican-American War. For its assistance Germany asked for Mexico's support in the war."¹

The Ford Motor Company did not provide any war material to the European combatants. Henry Ford was a pacifist. He did sponsor "The Peace Ship" in 1915 to Oslo, Norway. Nevertheless, from the spring of 1917 until the end of the War in November 1918, the Ford Motor Company supported the US war effort by producing war boats, military trucks and ambulances, cannons as well as research on armor technology<sup>2</sup>. Mc Calley<sup>3</sup> documents in 1917 that Ford produced 568,128 Touring cars, 1453 ambulances and 3 truck chassis. In 1918, they manufactured 432,519 Touring cars, 2136 ambulances and 41,105 truck chassis. The history of the Model T ambulance appears in the 2017 Lang catalogue. Roy and Bernice Young donated their reconstructed WWI era Model T ambulance to the MTFCA Museum

In the Tin Lizzie's club, I am aware of only two 1918 Model Ts. Dave Ferro has a depot Hack and Paul and Marilyn Duncan have a touring cutoff. It was common in the era to convert touring cars to a "homemade" pickup truck by cutting off the body behind the front seat and adding a wood box. The Cleveland Hardware Company produced bed hardware and provided free plans with the purchase of new iron fittings. We have one which we are restoring. Ford did not produce a pick-up bed until 1925 that fit on the roadster body.

Much of what we know about the factory produced Model T Touring cars between late 1916 and 1921 comes for the examination of the "Rip Van Winkle" Ford as documented in The Vintage Ford in 1978 and 1991 and reproduced in McCalley (p 261-74). There was still considerable body wood used in 1917 and in 1918. Big changes were introduced for the 1919 model year including optional demountable rims with 3.5 inches x 30 tires all around, optional starters and generators and more metal components.


