OFFICERS:

PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY TREASURER TO BE ELECTED by the membership for a term of one (1) year.

CHAIRPERSONS:

CHAIRPERSONS ARE TO BE ELECTED OR APPOINTED as needed.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL consist of three (3) Officers of the Club, and two (2) persons of the General Membership, elected annually.

ELECTIONS:

ELECTIONS ARE TO BE HELD ANNUALLY in November or December or as vacancies occur.

VOT ING:

EACH PAID NEMBER IN GOOD STANDING shall be entitled to one (1) vote.

CHANGES TO THE BYLAWS:

CHANGES TO THE BYLAWS SHALL require a 2/3 majority vote of the paid membership in good standing.
