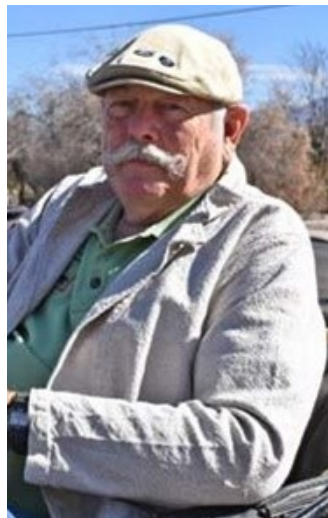

**Tour Dates:**

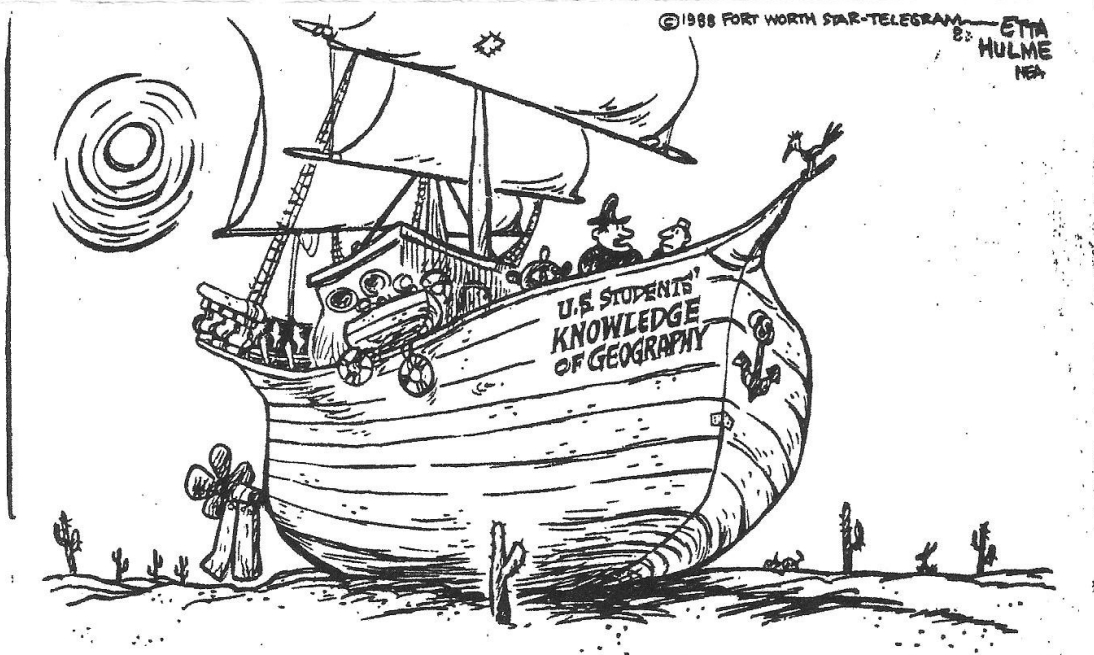
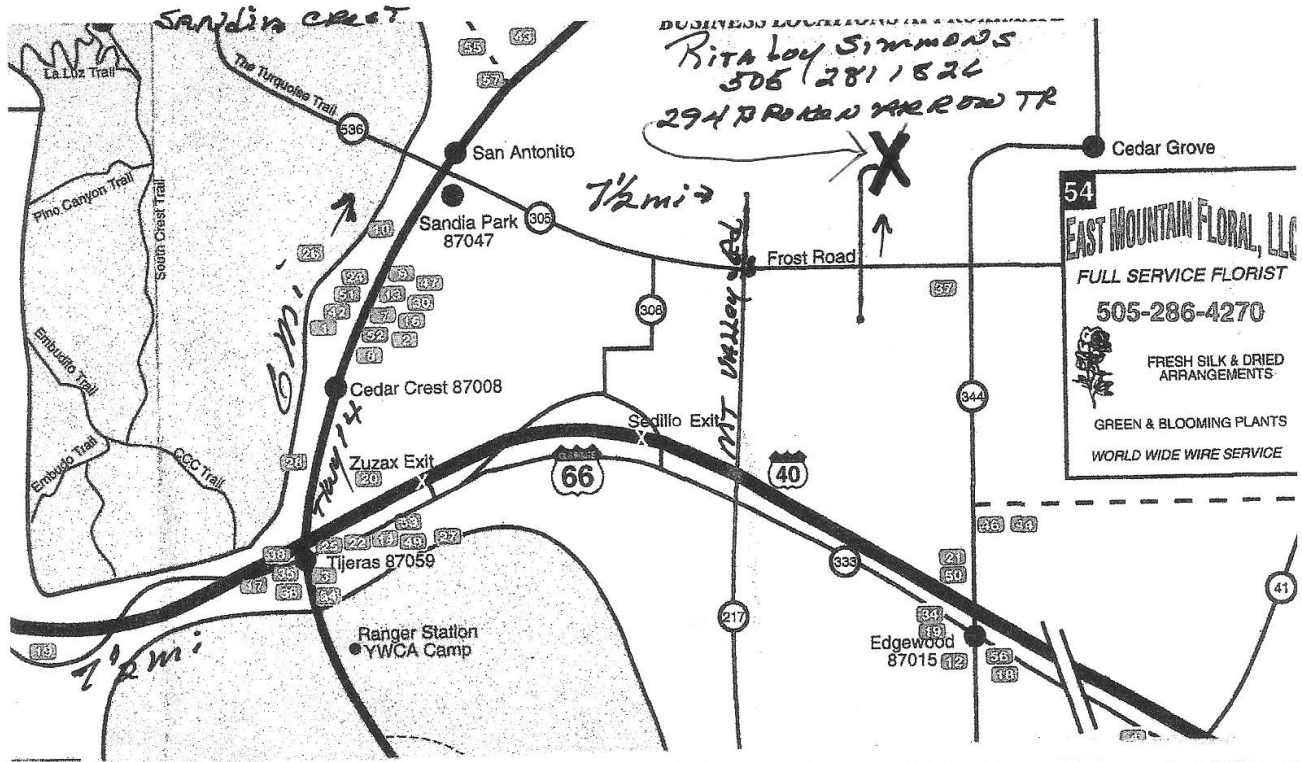
