

Tin Lizzies of Albuquerque Mesilla Valley Tour September 26-30, 2018 By Paul & Marilyn Duncan, Albuquerque Tour Coordinators

The Mesilla Valley Tour based in Las Cruces, NM had been in the planning stages for more than two years involving club members, Paul & Marilyn Duncan, Tom MacGugan, Kameron Peterson and Robbi Ross. On the first day, Wednesday September 26 participants gathered at the Hilton Garden Inn. Marilyn and Pat Willan registered the participants. That evening, Roger Walker, a lecturer at Doña Ana Community College Las Cruces led a discussion of historical aspects of New Mexico settlements including the East-West highways across New Mexico.

On Thursday September 27, thirteen T's and 2 A's left the hotel for a scenic 40-mile caravan drive through the verdant Mesilla Valley agricultural region to Santa Teresa, NM for a visit to War Eagles Air & Car Museum. We were welcomed by the Museum Executive Director, Bob Dockendorf and then toured the Museum's extensive collection of historic aircraft and classic cars that includes several Model Ts. During our time there, additional members of the Southwest Classic Car Club in El Paso brought their Model A's and Corvettes to join the car show at the Museum. We hosted nearly 50 people, including Tour participants, the Southwest Car Club members and Museum staff. Tour drivers returned on their own to the hotel.

On Friday September 27th, eight T's left the hotel early for the 136-mile round trip journey to White Sands National Monument. We crossed Las Cruces on the east side via Sonoma Ranch Road the Bataan Memorial Frontage road along US Hwy 70. Near Organ, NM we continued on Hwy 70 driving up and over the San Augustin Pass (6,000ft). The grade at the top of the Pass was 6% and the non-Ruckstell axle T's needed Low band for a short distance. Nearing the top of the Pass, Mark & Susan Wing's 1925 coupe developed a grinding noise in the transmission and we winched it onto the Trouble Trailer. On the East side of the Pass Vern and Pat Willan and Jeff Richards and Linda Riel turned off to tour the White Sands Missile Range Museum. The five remaining T's and the trouble trailer continued an additional 35 miles across the Tularosa Basin to the White Sands National Monument. The white sands in the Basin are gypsum crystals picked up by the prevailing winds and then deposited into dunes.

We stopped briefly at the Visitor Center and then drove an additional 8 miles on the scenic Dunes Drive to the Yucca picnic area. The last 3 miles is not paved and the white gypsum forms a hard and smooth driving surface similar to driving on ice.

The unique sun shaded picnic tables appeared as silver sails on a white sea! Each T parked at a separate table for their picnic lunch and many visitors stopped by to talk and look at the cars and take pictures. After lunch we hiked on the dunes and posed for pictures with the T's.

Following a top off of the gas tanks, all of the Monument group made the return with no major issues. Paul's 1920 was at the upper level of temperature and he needed to off load several of his passengers and Kirk Peterson's 1927 went through some fuel- starved hiccups.

Saturday September 29th was an unstructured day with many options. Many toured the nearby NM Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum and some drove the 10 miles up to the Dripping Springs Natural Area, while other enjoyed shopping and the Farmer's & Crafts Market in Downtown Las Cruces.

On Saturday evening the final banquet was held at the historic *La Posta de Mesilla* in the Old Town. Thirty -seven appeared for dinner and most were in their best vintage attire. Tour Coordinator, Paul Duncan presented Awards for the following: (1) Tour Coordinators, Tom MacGugan, Kameron Peterson and Marilyn Duncan (2) Tour Support including providing hospitality goods, photography and coordinating the Tour Photo Contest to Linda Riel, Mark & Susan Wing, Dave Ferro & Rebecca Wiegand (3) "Good Samaritan Award" to Sharron Geilenfeldt for stopping to assist the Merewethers following a tire blowout on I-25. (4) First Completed Tour Day Car Awards to Jeff Richard's 1925 Touring (The Colonel) for completing 2-full days of touring and Dave & Ann Merewether's 1922 Centerdoor for completing 1-full day of touring.

On Sunday September 30^{th} , all Tour participants loaded their cars and headed for home. Tour Coordinator, Kameron Peterson stayed at the hotel to make sure that everyone was loaded and on their way. All arrived safely home from the Tour.
