## President's Message May 2019

At the March 28, 2019 general membership meeting, Tin Lizzie members Barbara and Clyde Stanfield asked if someone from the club could assist them in starting their 1921 Roadster. I volunteered to come to their home the next day. I asked Neil O'Brien if he would be available as well since he lives nearby.

Barbara and Clyde are 23-year residents of Albuquerque. Barbara is a retired educator and Clyde a retired Methodist minister. Barbara grew up in Tucson. Her father was a mechanic and restored a number of Model T's including the 1921 Roadster that she and Clyde now own. In Albuquerque last spring, they drove the T around a cul-de-sac near their home in the NE Heights and the T stalled. It would not re-start. They pushed it back to the garage. They joined the Tin Lizzies in 2018.

I drove to their house and inspected the T. It is a beautiful restoration. There was gas and a spark at each cylinder. Neil arrived and we activated the starter. The battery was well charged and at one point it coughed but did not start. Neil went back to his shop for starter fluid. On his return the "magic fluid" was sprayed into the carburetor and bingo it started. It ran very smoothly after we adjusted the fuel mixture. Thanks to Neil for his assistance.

At this point, I asked Barbara to hop in and off we went. The car ran smoothly. Barbara and I toured the neighborhood and on return I asked Barbara to drive. She started the car, backed out into the street and off she went in low band with me in the passenger seat. She and Clyde both have had some Model T driving experience. Their neighborhood is one with cul-de-sacs and many stop signs. Barbara drove well and then it was Clyde's turn. Clyde needs a reverse pedal extension but once going forward he drove well. Now they need a big parking lot where they both can practice and one such lot is reasonably close to their home.

Let's **assist** this year **all members**, who have Model T's but are not driving them, to get their T's out and drive them. I will ask for club member volunteers to be Model T driving coaches and mentors for their T restoration and we will post the list in the newsletter and on the website.

## USAF (Air Force) ( Army/Air Corps was later divided into the US Air Force and US Army )

Willan, Vernon (Vern)

I entered the USAF at age 19 and worked as Jet Engine Mechanic on the F105 in Vietnam. "He got out of the service at Age 23 with VA assessed disability of 50%". (From Vern)



Young, Roy

He was an first in the Army Air Corp which later became the USAF. He was a pilot flying many different planes, but his love was the B-57 bomber which he flew during the Viet Nam conflict. He was based out of the Philippines and was wing man for Chuck Yeager who at that time was a Colonel. Roy served 29 1/2 years and retired as a Bird Colonel. There is a bench dedicated to him at the Veterans Park on Louisiana. Roy served for 4 years as President of the Tin Lizzies and stayed a loyal member until his death in 2007. (From Bernice)

Kranz, Steve

I entered the USAF when I was 22, at the tail end of Vietnam. I served 20 years with my final duty being tied to Desert Storm. I was 42 when I retired as a Major from the USAF at Kirtland AFB. I was stationed in several States and had overseas assignments to Iceland and Desert Storm. My primary duties were Helicopter Pilot and Air Staff Officer. As a Helicopter Pilot with 4,000 hours of time and earned the highest USAF pilot rating of "Command Pilot". I also had a career broadening assignment as a college AFROTC Instructor. I had many temporary assignments including the assignment in Iceland which was to provide air/sea rescue support for the AF and the Navy aircraft on station while my duty in Washington DC was to provide helicopter VIP support .

Up and down the eastern seaboard for Ronald Reagan's Presidential Cabinet, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and other senior dignitaries. My last (temporary) assignment was to provide airlift coordination and air staff support for Desert Storm combatants. I have been credited by the USAF with 21 peacetime "saves." My team and I, also worked out of Germany, coordinated the Desert Storm airlift movement of some 180,000 NATO troops out of Europe and into the desert during the four weeks preceding the start of the conflict. Tin Lizzie's — Socorro Car Show  
April 13, 2019

On a cool Saturday, eight Tin Lizzie members— John Burnett, Paul & Marilyn Duncan, Betty Houston, Steve Kranz, Frank & Susan Lewark, and Leonard Scarborough participated in the “Cruise for a Cause” car show along with other members from the Socorro Old Car Club held at the Houston Flea Market lot on Socorro’s California Street. This event was a fund raiser to benefit the Socorro Storehouse food pantry. With a donation to the cause, riders could get a ride in any of the assembled vehicles that included 4 Model Ts: Betty & Vernon Houston’s roadster (’19) driven by Paul Duncan, John & Carol Burnett’s roadster (’26), Frank & Susan Lewark’s touring (’26) and a Depot Hack (’26) owned by Bob Eveleth a member of the Socorro Old Car Club. Additional cars at the show included Steve Krantz’ Chevrolet Corvette (’80), Leonard Scarborough’s Chevy Sedan (’53) and the Houston’s Buick “Roadmaster” convertible (’46) and a Chevy “ Bel Air” (’57). All of the drivers were kept busy with enthusiastic riders. Coffee, tea and donuts were available along with a collection of free (after a donation) car parts and books. The Storehouse raised over \$600 from the event. The Socorro Blues Festival was also going on at the town Plaza providing music and food.

The Houston’s roadster was a former “project car” for the Tin Lizzies back in 2017 when the car came into Larry Azevedo’s shop for restoration work. Many Tin Lizzie members participated in doing the work to get it running mechanically and installed a new top and seat upholstery. Since then it had been parked in the Houston’s garage and Betty was thrilled that Paul offered to drive the T at the car show event. This required some routine fluid checks and discovered that the ignition switch needs some work in the future. However, to quote Betty “Thanks again for coming to help with this event. It was a blessing to see Vernon’s T tooling down the road.”

A future tour to Socorro has been proposed by several of the Tin Lizzie members including Betty Houston, Lewark’s, Burnett’s and Scarborough’s. The last overnight tour to the area was to Magdalena in 2004 and the only multi-day tour was an “Over the Hill Tour” held in 1988. The club is long overdue for another driving tour to the Socorro area. Betty has many connections in the community and secure trailer parking at her home. The Socorro Tin Lizzie members have lived in the community for many years and know the Model T friendly back roads. Paul Duncan toured the Mineral Museum at New Mexico Tech with Associate Curator Bob Eveleth (owns a T.) Marilyn and Betty Houston toured Socorro landmarks. On Sunday morning we gathered at Sophia’s Kitchen for breakfast. Then, the Lewark’s gave a tour of their home located on a hill above Lemitar (7 miles north of Socorro). This is a beautiful setting with horses, chickens and dogs as well as the highlight— Frank’s huge shop! The shop has two lifts and is filled with “current projects” including Leonard’s 1926 Tudor sedan in restoration and a large meeting area reserved for the Socorro Classic Car Club. Of note, Frank purchased the Lou Baudoin collection of Model T parts.

Then, Frank and Sue drove into a unique and primitive geological area, San Lorenzo Canyon a scenic area of mudstone cliffs, arches and hoodoos that is jointly managed by BLM and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Frank worked on a major BLM project there that removed salt cedar and planted native cottonwoods and knew the names of all the plants and even where to find a hidden spring in the desert!

The tour organizing group will assemble more details and a tour proposal for the Club. A date has not been set but could be organized quickly since most of the local details are already in mind.
