"Innovations"

With the blessings of the Tin Lizzies Board of Directors, we are going to initiate a new project that we hope will entertain and inform everyone who has an interest on Model T's. Most of our club members have benefited from the unpublished knowledge and experience gathered by associating with the drivers, mechanics, engineers and tinkerers who own T's. We realized that many of us have made discoveries and forged innovations on our own and that some of these are unique and maybe useful to other owners. We would periodically like to share our experiences by presenting "this is how you can do it" articles with enough tech details that you can take to your shop and turn out a finished product. Whether you have a bone stock T or a wild speedster, we hope you find something useful from "Innovations". Our first article, available now on the Tin Lizzies website is about designing and installing cycle fenders on a speedster. Enjoy, and let us know what you would like to see in future posts.

Here is an overview of our upcoming September tour Wednesday thru Sunday:

"A Trail and Two Rails For Santa Fe"

Plan to arrive Raton NM on September 18th in the early afternoon. Raton is approximately 230 miles from Albuquerque (around 3 hours and 30 minutes driving time).

Tour Headquarters in Raton: Best Western Plus on US 64 (473 Clayton Road) 1 (575) 445-8501
Group Rate: \$132/night

Alternative accommodations in the immediate vicinity: Quality Inn (next door) \$104.50 1(575) 445-4200, Casa Lemus Inn and Restaurant (across the highway) \$70 king and \$79 two queens 1(575) 445-4024. All three establishments have adequate trailer parking. A Microtel and Motel 8 are also near. For RVers, the Willow Springs RV Park is a couple of blocks away at 1025 Frontage Road 1(575) 445-1200.

On 18th and 19th, tour Raton vicinity, visit Sugarite Canyon State Park, Village of Folsom and Folsom Museum, Folsom Falls, Capulin Volcano National Monument, and drive across majestic Johnson Mesa (home of the former community of Bell).

On 20th, trailer cars from Raton to Clayton NM.
Tour headquarters in Clayton: the historic Eklund Hotel, 15 Main Street 1(575) 374-2551.
Group Rate: \$85/night

Alternative accommodations: Quality Inn and Suites (1120 South 1st Street) 1(575) 374-2551, Super 8 by Wyndham (1425 South 1st Street) 1(575) 374-8127. There are two RV parks in Clayton, Coyote Keeth's (1 Mary Bird Lane) 1(575) 447-5566, and Clayton RV Park (903 South 5th Street) 1(575) 374-9508.

On 20th and 21st, tour Clayton vicinity and visit Rita Blanca National Grassland, several Santa Fe Trail sites/landmarks, and Clayton Lake State Park where over 500 dinosaur tracks are visible.

Depart for home on the 22nd. Suggestion: visit Fort Union National Monument near Watrous on the way home.

Come join us for a fun tour of discovery in northeastern New Mexico. More detailed tour information to follow.

US Public Health Services/Indian Health Services

After completing our medical internships. I was drafted in the "physician draft" for the Viet Nam War. Marilyn and I reported for duty August 1, 1970 to the Alaska Native Medical Center in Anchorage, Alaska as a General Medical Officer in the Indian Health Service, a branch of the United States Public Health Service Commissioned Corps (PHS), one of the seven uniformed services of the United States, with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. My main field medical responsibility was as the physician liaison for the six Alaska Native communities on Kodiak Island outside of Kodiak City. Marilyn was a civilian physician working at the Alaska Native Medical Center and she accompanied me on twice yearly field clinics to Kodiak Island where we spent time in the 6 Island Native communities for six weeks at a time. Another part of my duty was the responsibility for care of injured/sick foreign and domestic merchant seamen in the Aleutian Chain of Islands, where Russian and Japanese fisherman commercially fished. After their care was completed they were accompanied back to their home country. When he wasn't doing the above tasks, he worked in a general medical clinic. He was honorably discharged in the summer of 1972 and used his post graduate Veteran's educational benefits at UNM. (From Paul Duncan)
