He even added for safety disk brakes. This is as close to a T that was just released from the Henry Ford factory that one will ever find. ## President's Message -- November 2019

The Raton-Clayton tour (A Trail and Two Rails to Santa Fe) was a real success. The eighteen Tin Lizzie's who took part over 5 days learned much about these two communities in northwest New Mexico and the area in-between. (see story in this issue of the Enchantment Flyer) This tour highlights one of successes of our Tin Lizzie Tours: you do not need to drive a Model T to take part and enjoy the tour. On this tour sisters Sharon Geilenfeldt and Rita-Loy Simmons and Tom and Cathy Miles didn't bring a T but participated in all activities and added to everyone's enjoyment. Orlando Ortega, Tin Lizzie member from Portales, joined 5 T's, a Clayton A, and toured in his 1931 Model A. We welcome members touring in non-Model T antique cars or modern cars. You can dress up in vintage clothes and enjoy the activities regardless of what you are riding in!!

This year there has been lots of club supported opportunities to drive our cars. In March and August, we were at the two Rich Ford locations-one in Albuquerque and the other Edgewood where 25 T's and 35 Tin Lizzie members participated in the two events. We had 4 T's in Socorro for the fundraiser organized by Betty Houston along with 9 Tin Lizzie members. At the two Power Ford events- Memorial and Labor days-16 T's participated and 25 Tin Lizzie members. Six T's and 13 Tin Lizzie members participated in a mini-tour and picnic to Brian Dean's home off south 14 in June. Fourteen T's were in the Corrales July 4<sup>th</sup> parade. At the Harvey House celebration in Los Lunas in July there were 6 T's and 13 Tin Lizzies. We had 16 T's at the State Fair and many relatives and friends rode into the fair in members Touring T's and depot hacks.

One of the Tin Lizzie's missions is to encourage members with T's to keep them in excellent and safe running condition. The work days at Larry's garage in Corrales are organized for this reason. I have observed that many members, over the 10 years that we have been in the club, have become capable Model T diagnosticians and mechanics. One of my goals this year is to get members who have "an almost running T" over to Larry's to finish the task. It is gratifying, for those who participate in these exercises, to see another running T on the road! Currently Don Neidig's coupe is getting a "valve job" and Al Schwanke's touring is getting two new transmission drums, low and reverse, ordered from Dave Nolting's shop in Ohio. In both cases, the T's were transported to Larry's by club members volunteering their trailers for transport.

Along with restoring and driving Model T's, the other mission of the Tin Lizzie's is: **To promote good will and fellowship among members and the community.** Our members who participated in the recent tour to Raton and Clayton really embraced the residents of Raton and Clayton and they in return embraced us. Our tour was featured on local radio and in the local newspapers and we participated in the Raton "homecoming parade". We added new members to the Tin Lizzies from both communities. I believe many on the tour plan to return to these communities in the future.

Getting a T to a work day with a volunteer Tin Lizzie member with a trailer October 28, 2019 Paul Duncan

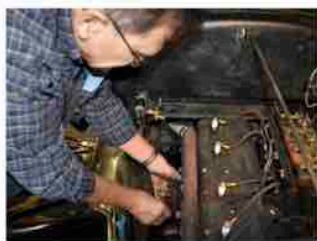
There are a number of Tin Lizzie members with T's in their garage that will run if only they could get them to a work day. Within the month of October there have been two such members. Don Neidigk's 1926 Coupe was trailered to Larry's by Mark Dominguez and leaking valves were identified. Volunteer members assisted with a valve job and on the October 26th work day the car was started but with difficulty. A temperamental ignition switch was identified along with a badly worn spark advance linkage. Larry believed the switch was too unreliable for a trip to Rio Rancho. Paul Duncan trailered Don's car back to his home but Don drove the car off the trailer and into the garage. He will rework the switch at the upcoming work day November 2.

Al Schwanke drove his 1927 Touring to a workday to sort out "why the T didn't do well climbing modest hills". When the transmission cover was removed, a lot of sticky gray material was observed to be caught in the magnetic strainer. A closer look revealed cracked low and reverse drums. The sticky gray matter was Kevlar band material chewed up by the sharp edges of two cracked drums. The engine was removed and dismantled and new parts including new drums were ordered. The engine-less body was winched onto Paul Duncan's trailer and was taken back to Al's garage.

If after reading these vignettes, the reader says to himself: "If only I could get my T over to Larry's garage on a workday" call me and I will assist.



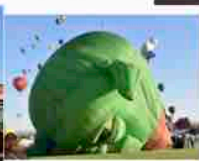
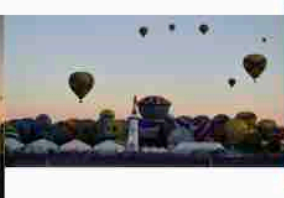
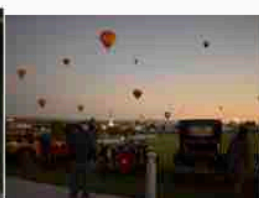
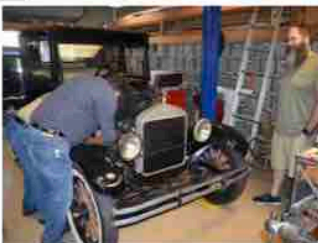

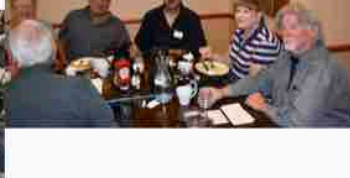

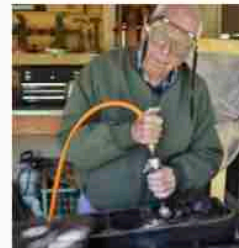

President Duncan gave a special recognition to members John Hayne, Larry and Lorna Azevedo, Larry and Joan Langdon, Al and Marilyn Schwanke, Molly Cunningham, Janice Gauna, Sharon Geilenfeldt, Vern and Pat Willan, Gerald and Linda Hash, Tom and Cathy Miles, Scott Stewart, Lena Schritter, Sharon and Mark Dominguez. This is our 40th anniversary and the above individuals joined the club during the first 10 years. The Schritter-Dominguez family has four generations of members and the Azevedo's and Wing's three. Minutes of September 26, 2019 meeting were approved as printed in the Enchantment Flyer, October 2019.
