A large contingent of Tin Lizzies of Albuquerque attended the recent MTFCA National Tour in Spokane, WA. The Tour named "Ts on Tour in the **Inland Empire**" was hosted by the Inland Empire Chapter. There were 5 driving days and the total driving miles was around 500. The Tin Lizzie participants arrived from all directions.

Paul & Marilyn Duncan registered as Passengers since they were driving a modern car from Seattle back to Albuquerque. Shortly before leaving Albuquerque, Neil & MaryAnn O'Brien realized that their 1916 Touring car had developed a major problem, so they left the T and pulled a modern car behind their motor home. Nita & Duane Nicholson from Rochester, WI arrived with their 1922 coupe but Duane had problems getting it to start. He changed spark plugs and made additional adjustments and they were able to eventually drive their T for several days. Larry & **Lorna Azevedo** brought their red 1926 Speedster to the Tour. Half-way through the first driving day, the Speedster broke a valve spring keeper pin and the T spent the rest of the Tour parked on their trailer. The Azevedos then rode the rest of the tour as passengers with Vern & Pat Willan in their 1926Touring. Mark & Sharon Dominguez brought their 1923 Roadster ("Sam") and it ran well for several days. Then, the T lost High Gear, possibly due to worn fiber clutch discs. They parked "Sam" and **Mark** rode with **Kirk Peterson's** 1924 Coupe. **Sharon Dominguez** rode with **Susan Peterson** and **Olive** in a modern air conditioned car.

Member Shop Work Update

Member Garage Shop Projects

- 1. **Paul & Marilyn Duncan** have finally completed their 1918 Touring Cut-Off chassis restoration. A 1926 engine and the original 1918 differential have been rebuilt. Also we added a replacement front axle. The original wood felloe wheels off of our 1920 touring needed several new rivets to fix the felloe to the clincher rim. We found out that mounting the 3inch front tires is considerably more difficult than the 3.5-inch rear tires. Tin Lizzie member Mark **Dominguez** demonstrated some of the tire mounting tricks that he learned over the years from his father-in-law Tin Lizzie Club Model T restorer, Clarence Schritter. Mark's coordination and arm strength made all the difference.
- 2. **Don Neidigk** has completed his engine and differential rebuild. The Coupe body is on the lift for several areas of metal repair. Don is very close to reassembly.
- 3. **Dave Ferro** has been readying his 1924 Touring car for the upcoming Fall Tour. Several years ago, he purchased the Touring from Club member Orlando **Ortega.** Dave's brother-in-law and Tin Lizzie Club member, **Fred Kammerer**, from Gettysburg, PA is planning to drive the T in the Las Vegas Tour. Recently, he mounted 5 new 3.5 inch tires with assistance from Mark Wing and Paul Duncan. Dave's speedster project is still a "work in progress."
- 4. **Larry Azevedo** has started a new Montana 500 car project. His recent experience riding with Kirk Peterson in "Buster" ramped up his enthusiasm to build his own race car for the next endurance race in 2022. His racing T will be a 1926 Roadster that has previously been used as the Club "Take Apart" car for the NM State fair. He had a "spare" 1926-27 engine block in storage and will rebuild it to comply with Montana 500 guidelines. Late Model T Roadsters are the cars that are most frequently raced in the Montana 500. They weigh the least, have a lower center of gravity and are most amenable to needed

race modifications. Shock absorber use is permitted and might be a good addition to our own Ts.

- 5. **Al Schwanke** has returned to work on the Azevedo 1938 Packard restoration and has been buffing and polishing the massive fenders. After a long "COVID Break," Al is back on the "Shop Crew" again. Welcome back!
- 6. **Mark Wing** has started working on his newly acquired (see p. 7) 1909 Model T project. So far, the engine and parts appear to be in excellent vintage condition. Mark is doing diligent research to make sure it will be restored as close to "original" Ford factory specs as possible.

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Wing's 1909 Model T Arrives in Albuquerque

1909 Model T's

In early June 2021, an ad was posted on the MTFCA classifieds for "a very complete 1909 touring project". This Model T was in Burbank, CA, 18 miles from Culver City where I grew up in Southern California. Kim Dobbins, one of the foremost experts on early Model Ts, was selling three brass-era Model Ts and parts from the

estate of his friend, the late Chad Champlin. I had purchased parts from Kim in the past at the Bakersfield pre-war swap meet and at his home. Based on the rarity of the car and the condition of the parts, I committed to buying the project sight-unseen. A week later, I picked up the car with my enclosed trailer. I wasn't disappointed as the condition of the parts was as described. In addition to an authentic restorable touring body, the project came with a 1909/10 Ray Wells reproduction body.

The engine block is serial number 8143, with no casting date, which is correct for early Model T production. The McCalley book lists the assembly date as August 2, 1909. According to McCalley, all Model Ts built in calendar year 1909 are considered to be 1909 cars but Ford was

advertising that August 1, 1909, would be beginning of their 1910 model cars starting with

serial number 8101. I was surprised to find that 8143 is listed in the McCalley index (pg. 484). It turns out that Bruce McCalley lived in Burbank and he and Chad Champlin were members of the same MTFCA chapter and probably friends. I had thought that the 1909 body that I was purchasing was original to the chassis, but the McCalley book listed 8143 as a "Tourabout" body style with "no lamps or equipment". A

lamps or equipment". A "Tourabout" body looks like a 1909 roadster with two identical scalloped-shaped seats both front and rear, and therefore no doors. It was a body style new for the 1910 model year.

I'm currently waiting for the Benson Ford Research Center build sheet to arrive so I can confirm that McCalley's index entry is correct. If everything checks out. my 8143 may be the earliest surviving Model T "Tourabout" in existence! Ray Wells,"The Craftsman" in El Cajon, CA can make a new "Tourabout" body for me, so I can return the car to a configuration close to what it was when it rolled out of the Detroit Ford Piquette Factory in

rolled out of the I Ford Piquette Fac 1909. I will provide periodic updates on the progress of this interesting restoration.
